SMERU Activities



Representatives from SMERU, the Ministry of National Development Planning/Bappenas, and UNISBA had an audience with the Secretary of the West Java Provincial Government, Dr. Ir. Setiawan Wangsaatmaja, Dipl., S.E., M.Eng., in Bandung, on June 16, 2023. During the meeting, SMERU presented the findings of the Participatory Research on Children's Subjective Well-being in West Java, showed a video of the study, and sought input regarding disseminating the study results.



The Cambodia Development Resource Institute (CDRI), a policy research institute from Cambodia, visited SMERU on June 9, 2023, to extend a partnership and collaborative network invitation as part of the "Thnal Odom Chomnes" research program supported by DFAT. SMERU is one of the three research institutes in Indonesia invited by CDRI to join this partnership. CDRI Director, Dr. Chea Phal, and SMERU Director, Widjajanti Isdijoso, signed a memorandum of understanding to formalize the partnership.



SMERU was one of the FPCI Climate Unit partners in the Indonesia Net-Zero Summit (INZS) 2023, held on June 24, 2023, in Jakarta. INZS is an annual climate conference organized by the Foreign Policy Community of Indonesia (FPCI), which also serves as a platform for multiple stakeholders to discuss and express aspirations related to Indonesia's net-zero emission goals. This initiative aims to strengthen Indonesia's commitment to safeguard the nation's future from the climate crisis.
